## **Questions for Further Reflection from Lusaka Gathering**

## **Participant-Generated Questions:**

- **1. Transforming the Community:** "As a leader seeking community transformation, what can I do on a daily basis to transform the community, even if it's one person at a time?"
- **2. Involvement in Crisis Resolution:** "As a communication specialist and broadcaster, how best can I be involved in solving the issues or crises in terms of mentorship and leadership?"
- **3. Co-Creating Solutions:** "How, as a community leader, can I be a part of co-creating solutions to impact the crises we encounter daily?"
- **4.** Taking Advantage of Crises: "Why do people take advantage when there's a crisis?"
- **5. Impacting the Community:** "As a senior pastor returning to my community, how will I affect the community?"
- **6. Being a Good Counsellor:** "How can I be a good counsellor, given the many problems emerging in the community and churches?"

## **Overview Summary (Takeaway)**

The questions posed by the participants reflect a deep commitment to personal and communal transformation, particularly in the areas of leadership, mentorship, and crisis response. The emphasis on daily actionable steps, ethical leadership during crises, and the role of communication and counselling are recurring themes. These questions reveal a strong desire to not only understand the crises affecting their communities but also to actively participate in addressing them. For the facilitation team, these reflections are crucial as they highlight the need for continued focus on practical, ethical, and community-orientated leadership development. They also underscore the importance of creating spaces for leaders to explore their roles in fostering resilience and providing guidance during times of crisis.
