What is the role and place of the church in Nairobi in responding to the crisis of Cultural and Social Influences?

- **Influencing Policy and Social Justice**: The church should engage in influencing policies that address social issues, such as early marriage or female genital mutilation (FGM). It can push for punitive measures against harmful practices while promoting positive cultural shifts.

- Advocating for Social Justice: The local church community should actively advocate for social justice and accountability, holding leaders and institutions responsible for ensuring equitable social policies and practices.
