

At the conclusion of the gathering in Sekiwunga, we asked the participants to each provide one question that they were taking with them from here for further reflection. This comes from the understanding that we have gathered 'to listen', 'to learn', 'to ask better questions'.

Here are some of the questions as asked:

1. How can we establish and maintain more churches to address the spiritual and practical needs of our communities?
2. What can be done to offer comfort and support to those in the most challenging situations, particularly those we preach to?
3. How can we effectively raise the necessary resources to fund the building and development of churches and other community projects?
4. How can we ensure that the message of God reaches more people, especially those in the most remote or neglected areas?

Overview Summary (Takeaway for the Facilitation Team):

The issues raised by the participants revolve around **community empowerment** through the church, focussing on the **expansion of religious infrastructure** and **reaching underserved populations**. There is a significant emphasis on the need for **practical support** for vulnerable groups in the community, including spiritual guidance, comfort, and addressing material needs like funding for church construction. Additionally, the need for strategic dissemination of the **gospel message** to wider and often neglected communities reflects a desire for **inclusive outreach**. These reflections point to a need for further dialogue on sustainable resource generation, mentorship, and expanding the church's reach in addressing both spiritual and socioeconomic challenges.
